
Make an in-kind donation

Hockey has always been an integral part of Jordan Verleye's life. Originally from Livonia, MI, she began her hockey journey at age 7. Her love and dedication for the game led her from learning the game on her hometown ice, to playing AAA travel hockey, and eventually to playing for a Division 3 college in St. Paul MN. After previous moves to Detroit and California, Jordan decided to relocate to Fort Collins in 2019 where she found a hockey community that welcomed her with open arms. On May 22nd 2021, Jordan was the passenger in a treacherous rollover car accident which resulted in multiple very severe injuries. Jordan endured hospitalization, therapies, as well as many costly medical procedures during her recovery such as spinal surgery, jaw surgery and facial reconstruction surgeries.

While she continues to work diligently towards a complete recovery that allows her to get back on the ice again, Jordan is struggling to pay accumulated medical bills. Financial assistance is much needed from FCPHA and its members to get this tremendous athlete back on her feet, playing the sport that she loves.
